


Welcome address

## Introductory remarks

# Inaugural address

In his inaugural address, Mr. V. Venkatesan, former Director, MPEDA and a member of the Fisheries Technocrats Forum thanked the authorities of the American College for offering the nice meeting venue and extending all facilities. The FTF has taken interest in the southern states of Tamil Nadu for this Meet, because not much information is available on the resources, current status of aquaculture and future prospects of these districts. Leaving the past glorious pearl and chank fisheries, presently too southern states can boast the following: fish processing factories in Tuticorin, unique blue swimming crab fishery including related processing industry, lobster fishery of Kannyakumari district, first tilapia fish hatchery in Madurai Dt. and a host of ornamental fish production centres. The so called water deficiency in the southern districts need not be a constraint in developing aquaculture, provided we know what innovative technology we need to apply for development. The real constraints are lack of entrepreneurship, lack of technology for adoption to conditions specific to southern states, use of proper marketing tools etc. The government has a great role to play in promoting aquaculture in these districts. He hoped that this meet will help for a free-flow of information and suggestions for increasing the aquaculture opportunities in southern part of Tamil Nadu

Dr. Soundararajan, Vice-Chairman, FTF, Chennai for his introductory remarks, Mr. V. Venkatesan, former Director of MPEDA for inauguration, scientists from CIFA, CMFRI, MPEDA & RGCA for their participation, Mr. V. Ravichandran. Dr. R. Soundararajan, Mr. M. Kathirvel, Dr. P. Nammalwar & Dr. P. Gandheeswari of FTF for their involvement in organizing the meet, staff and students from Dept. of Zoology of American College for their co-operation and fish/shrimp farmers and private entrepreneurs for kindly coming from different parts of Tamil Nadu and Pondicherry to take part in the meet.

#### Recommendations

#### Freshwater Aquaculture

- 1. To promote freshwater fish culture, there should be a well defined policy for allotment of government "Poramboke" lands to land-less entrepreneurs on long term lease of 10 years at a nominal fee.
- 2. Techniques of recirculation of precious water should be developed and popularised in fish culture as well as agriculture.
- 3. As Nile tilapia is suitable for short-term culture, the state government should promote tilapia culture through providing incentives / subsidies for establishment of hatchery/farms/feed mill etc. Currently, there is scarcity for Nile tilapia seeds in Tamil Nadu.
- 4. Sufficient infrastructure facilities such as independent nursing and rearing ponds should be created for supplying stocking-size Nile tilapia seeds.
- Awareness campaign has to be undertaken among the rural youth on the advantages
  of culturing economically important Indian and exotic fish /ornamental fishes to
  increase fish production and to create more employment opportunities in the rural
  areas.
- 6. The Inland Fisheries Research Stations in Tamil Nadu should develop field level technologies to produce seeds and to rear the costlier native fishes such as Aiyirai/spiny loach (Lepidocephalichthys thermalis) and Viral/Murrel (Channa marulius/Channa punctata/Channa striata) and the State Government should popularise the viable technologies among the inland fishers since these fishes have huge demand and require limited water.
- 7. Many of the inland fish growers are not aware of the fact that their farm should get registered with the District Assistant Director of Fisheries. The State Government should take effective steps to get all the private aqua farms and public water bodies are getting registered with the District Fisheries Office.
- 8. All the District headquarters shall have at least one Aquaculture Laboratories to help the fish farmers to test the quality of farm water and soil. Besides, these Laboratories shall undertake fish disease diagnosis and suggest suitable treatment methods, especially for ornamental fishes.

#### Recommendations-Contd.

# Brackishwater Aquaculture

- 1. The State government should take necessary steps to increase the brackish water area under shrimp culture. For this purpose, the government may allow abandoned paddy fields (e.g. abandoned for over 20 years due to non-availability of Cauvery water in the coastal belt of Nagapattinam district) to convert into brackish water aquaculture areas and also to allot the suitable "poromboke" lands in coastal areas to landless small entrepreneurs on a long term lease of 10 to 15 years.
- 2. Sea Bass culture to be popularized as the farmed fish is getting good price. There is scarcity for sea bass seeds. As construction of a hatchery is a costly venture, the State government should build a hatchery for supply of seeds. A manual in vernacular language for the control of parasites in the culture of sea bass may be brought out by concerned agencies, to educate the farmers.
- 3. The State Government should establish Aquaculture Laboratories in all the coastal Districts to help the farmers for testing quality of seed/farm water & soil/farm produce.

#### Mariculture

- 1. National Mariculture Policy should be finalized at the earliest to popularize mariculture of fish and sea weeds and to utilize the vast areas of sea for the benefit of coastal rural fisherfolks.
- 2. National Funding Agencies like NFDB and NABARD should play a larger role in formulating suitable schemes for uplifting the socio-economic of coastal rural fishermen, in consultation with the State Government.

#### Technical Session I

Present status of aquaculture technologies and practices in three core areas Freshwater fish culture



- Mr. G. Chandrasekaran, former Asst. Director of Fisheries & FTF member: About 3,000 ha in freshwater areas in Nagapattinam, Thanjavur and Thiruvarur districts brought under fish cultivation; fries and fingerlings available from Govt. and private hatcheries for stocking purposes; such sources to be utilised for expansion of fish cultivation in southern districts of Tamil Nadu.
- Mr. S. Vaitheeswaran, M/s SVARA Biotechnovations, Madurai: Efforts since 2011 in production and supply of GIFT tilapia fry through the funding of NFDB and marketing live tilapia. The electricity power tariff is higher when compared to that of Karnataka and Kerala. However, the recycling of water in tilapia farming is highly advantageous, thereby reducing the quantity of water and electrical power consumption considerably.
- Mr. M.N. Paramasivam, Joint Secretary, Tamil Nadu Fish Farmers Association, Orathanadu, Thanjavur Dt: Chosen fish culture as an alternative avocation in lieu of agriculture since 2000; an extent of 6 acres for the purpose and two crops per year; started selling live fish from 2003; fish seed production since 2008 for self use as well as selling to other fish farmers; advocated diversification of fish culture using locally available species; faced problems in growing seabass in freshwater and sought diagnosis of diseases occurring during farming; dissemination of knowledge on rules and regulations to be followed to farming community for better yield and profit; demand for free supply of electricity as in the case of agriculture.
- Mr. K. Dineshkumar, M/s Aquagardens, Kadachanadhal, Madurai: Production and sale of more than 50 species of ornamental fishes for the last 30 years,
- Mr. B.J. Kesavakumar, Ornamental fish culturist, Madurai: Raising ornamental fish simple and highly profitable; expansion of this venture depending on government support and subsidy; suggestion for using temple tanks, many sale centres and women entrepreneurship to boost the trade.
- Mr. C.S. Ranganathan, Former Inspector of Fisheries & FTF member (M/s Kamaraj Fish Farm, Karanthai, Thanjavur): Tackled water scarcity in an innovative way, through recycling and judicious use of electricity for water pumping; organic load and oxygen depletion regulated effectively by practicing manure and water management; reduced the feed cost by using coconut oilcake in lieu of groundnut oil cake; cost input for production of 1 kg fish around Rs.60/- and fish sale price at Rs. 120/-per kg; tremendous change in consumer preference of fish over the years.

# Brackishwater fish/shrimp farming



Dr. Elancheran, M/s Allwin Aquatech shrimp hatchery, Marakanam, Tamil Nadu: Switching over from tiger shrimp culture to that of Pacific Blue shrimp (*Penaeus vannamei*) and the latter cultivation in saline, brackishwater and freshwater regimes; feasibility of polyculture of Pacific blue shrimp with seaweed, bivalves (clam), etc. for increased production and profitability; cost of production of 1 kg of Pacific blue shrimp around Rs. 240 and the market price for 1 kg shrimp around Rs. 430/-; for tiger prawn, Rs. 350/kg and Rs. 700/kg production cost and sale price respectively; future expansion depending upon the government policies such as subsidised electrical power rates.

Mr. M. Selvakumar, Shrimp farmer, Ramanathapuram: Successful farming of Pacific blue shrimp in ecologically balanced environment and realising good profit due greater demand from export trade.

Mr. G. Alexander, Technical Officer, Regional Centre of MPEDA, Nagapattinam: 5,000 ha brackishwater available for farming in Nagapattinam and neighbouring districts; presently 300 to 500 ha developed; issue such as use of antibiotics in hatchery and culture operation and its negative impact on the mindset of importing countries; as a part of ensuring the quality of shrimp seed and stock, testing to a tune of 10-15% carried out at present; for full coverage, more govt./private laboratories needed.

Dr. T. Frederick Rajkumar, Co-ordinator, Dept. Aquaculture, The American College-Community College: Aquaculture less popular in many areas due to lack of awareness and skill; intensive awareness campaigns and training programmes to be organized to promote brackishwater fish and shrimp culture.



- Dr. R. Jayakumar, Senior Scientist, Regional Centre of CMFRI, Mandapam Camp: Expressing concern the oceans becoming dump yard for waste, in spite of its rich resource; navigation and fishing two significant activities; oceans potential for commercial fish culture not fully utilized so far; suitable climate and good seawater very much favourable for developing large scale sea farming; cage culture, a proven technology especially in the offshore areas and high-quality fishes like cobia, pompano, ornamentals, lobster, seaweed etc. profitably cultured; farming technologies and economics for different culture species outlined.
- Mr. M.L. Seeni (Satham), Fish farmer, Maraikayarpattinam, Ramanathapuram Dt.: Faced difficulties in fishing avocation and also depletion in fish catches etc.; switched over to open sea cage culture introduced by CMFRI for his livelihood; adopting of scientific method of such cage culture of fish yielding good profit consistently.
- Mr. B. Thomnic, Fish farmer, Pamban, Rameswaram, Ramanathapuram Dt.: Citing livelihood issues and indiscriminate and illegal fishing practices affecting the fish stock; switched over to cage culture of fish and lobster in 2014 and earning a profit of Rs. 1 lakh per annum.
- Mr. V. Nagadoss, Lobster culturist, Mandapam, Ramanathapuram Dt.: Emphasizing the adoption of cage culture as a diversified livelihood from that of traditional and seasonal fishing activities; rearing of the juvenile lobsters collected from wild and the growing period about seven months; feeding with clam meat; suggestion of taking up clam and mussel culture and meeting the food requirement of reared lobsters; excess production of clam and mussel to be sold in local markets for human consumption, to add up the profit; availability of natural stocking material at appropriate time, as the major constraint; continuous supply of stocking material for sustainability of lobster culture.
- Mr. L. Mohamed, Seaweed culturist, Mandapam Camp, Ramanthapuram Dt.: Engaged in culturing seaweed since 2012 to support his livelihood; culture period 45 to 90 days; earning around Rs. 1000 per day after a gestation period of initial seeding; expressing concern over the low price offered against its true value.

# Freshwater aquaculture

#### Points raised by farmers/private entrepreneurs/students:

#### On the Govt. policies:

- > Allotment of "Poramboke" govt. land to landless farmers.
- > Delay in getting licence for new farms.
- > Drought years to be excluded from the annual leasing period of freshwater bodies for stocking and harvest of fish.

#### On the farm front:

- > Saline water intrusion affecting fish culture.
- > Higher electricity charges in Tamil Nadu, compared to neighbouring states like Andhra Pradesh and Kerala.
- > Demanding free electricity as in the case of agriculture.
- > A minimum depth of water, harvesting fish lesser than half kg and recirculation of water for overcoming the shortage of water supply.

- Experiencing difficulties while transporting broodfish, fry and fingerlings with oxygen cylinder at interstate entry point; needs special permit to carry oxygen cylinders.
- > CIFA for taking up of "Jayant" Rohu for increasing fish production and ready to supply broadfish stock on trial basis.
- > Clearing wastes accumulated in the ponds and tanks with the application of probiotics.
- > State government to establish Nile tilapia broodfish stock and hatchery facility for its popularization, meeting fry/fingerling demand and pond production.
- > State govt. help needed for getting necessary permit from central government for importing Nile tilapia/GIFT tilapia broodfish for private hatcheries.
- Fish feed not available within the state and to be procured from neighbouring state after incurring heavy cost on transport.
- > Prevalence of parasitic diseases in the cultured sea bass to be contained.
- Live fish trade to be popularized by more market avenues and good price.



#### Ornamental fish culture:

- > Introduction of more alien fish species endangering the native species and thus affecting the country's fish biodiversity, for example, the proliferation of 'tank cleaner fish'.
- > Supply of quality brooders of important fishes for domestication and propagation.
- > Cost reduction for live fish transport.

- > District level periodical exposure and training in advanced techniques for new entrepreneurs as well as for those who are already in the trade by government agency.
